Who came up with the banners?

Axminster's colourful street banners are an Axminster Chamber of Commerce initiative designed to give a lift to the town centre. The trail has grown over the past three years to over 30 banners, each of them telling a story of the town's past and its present. The project draws strength from a dedicated team of volunteers who stitch, design, paint and display the banners.



The competition

This fun competition is for children in two age groups - 5 to 9 years and 10 to 14 years. You will need a parent's /guardian's approval to enter, and they must sign your entry form with their contact details. They should also accompany you on your banners hunt if you are under 10 years.

What we want you to do

 Find the 30 banners that are spread over West Street, Trinity Square, Chard Street, George Street, Victoria Place, Castle Hill, South Street and Silver Street. Note down on the sheet where you find each banner, either the place or the business where they are displayed.

Design your own banner on the sheet provided to show why you think Axminster is special.
Add your first name and age where shown and ask your parent /guardian to fill in their details.
Deliver your completed entry to Axminster Printing by Monday 2nd September 2024. Our judges will select prize winners in each age group and we will then announce the winners on Friday 6th September 2024. The judges' decision is final.




1 & 2. The Axminster Coat of Arms

Whichever direction you go from Axminster you are quickly into some of Britain's most stunning landscape.




3. Tribute to a Great Monarch


5. A Town With a Heart


9. Built on Independent Traders


10. Wild and Wonderful

Axminster was once an important British centre for the manufacture of tooth, nail and hairbrushes, employing hundreds of local people.



13. The Power of Community


Axminster is particularly strong when it comes to community, with a pervading sense of caring and belonging.


17. Shed Drives Projects

Today, there are no above ground signs of it but for many years Newenham Abbey was the single most important building in the original parish of Axminster.



Did you know that Axminster is famous for feathers? They appear in films and on TV, military finery, fashion accessories and quill pens.






29. Skatepark is on a Roll
